The Devil's Arithmetic by Jane Yolen Final Project DUE FRIDAY JUNE 2

Choose ONE of the following activities to do for your final project.

Assignments will be graded on accuracy, mechanics (spelling, grammar, punctuation), meeting all requirements listed in directions, creativity, effort, and neatness. No assignments will be accepted late. All projects are worth 100 points.

- 1. Create a mobile, diorama, or other visual display depicting a scene/event from the novel. You must include a well-written description of the scen/event you recreated. You must also include a one-page summary of the novel.
- 2. Draw a map of all the concentration camps in Europe during World War II. Map must be well made and accurate. Include a map key. Maps will not be accepted on notebook paper. Use poster board or a display board. Research 5 of the concentration camps, and write a paragraph about each. Write a one-page summary of the novel, in which you make connections between what happened to the Hannah and the other characters in the novel, and what actually happened in these concentration camps.
- 3. For every 2 chapters of the story, draw a detailed picture, in order to help you remember the characters and important events that took place throughout the novel. You must include detailed captions of who or what you are drawing. You should have a total of 10 pictures and captions. Arrange the pictures into an "album". It must be neat. No notebook paper. Full color pictures and complete sentences for captions! You must also include a one-page summary of the novel.
- 4. At the end of the novel, the author explains the true parts of the story. Much of the story is based on the experiences of the author's family. Research the Holocaust and create a PowerPoint or Google Slides or other presentation to explain the true aspects of the story. You must also include a one-page summary of the novel.
- 5. Make a quilt using 12 "fabric" squares. Each square should illustrate a scene, character, event or a thing from the novel. On a separate sheet of paper, type, or neatly write a description of each square and its significance to the novel. Attach your descriptions to the back of your "quilt". You must also include a one-page summary of the novel.
- 6. Pretend that you are Hannah/Chaya living in the "dream world". Write a letter to Rosemary, Hannah's best friend in New Rochelle, explaining what you think is going on around you in your new world. Your postcard should reveal and discuss at least 10 events that have taken place, people you have met, and activities that you have been participating in since your arrival in this "dream world", and you must create a "photograph" of one of the events, people, or activities you wrote about. Remember you are writing to Rosemary as if you are Hannah/Chaya.
